Firstly, volunteering allows students to connect with people and understand the importance of helping others who are having trouble. This will lead them to care about others and take action to support those in need.

Also, volunteering raises students' motivation to learn new things. For instance, when they volunteer at a local animal shelter, they will learn about animal behavior and care, perhaps stimulating an interest in the study of biology or the science of animal behavior.

Thirdly, students gain valuable skills that ⁽²⁾they can teach to their friends. Let's suppose that they help with community events. They can practice talking to different people or working out solutions to problems. If unexpected issues occur at such events, like running short of supplies, they can learn to think independently and cooperate with others to find solutions. These are useful skills for navigating various life situations.

Lastly, volunteering encourages people to get involved in their community as responsible citizens. They can develop a sense of belonging to their community, which will stay with them for the rest of their lives and make them want to do helpful things for their communities. This helps create adults who care about making society better every day.

To wrap up, volunteering can encourage students to develop consideration for others, acquire new knowledge and practical social skills, and ⁽³⁾ become friends with a lot of people.

Horses' Ways of Expressing Their feelings

Daisy Taylor (Horse-riding Instructor)

Horses are smart and charming animals which have lived with us for a long time. They are expressive, so we can easily understand how they feel from their expression and their movements, without language.

Every day we take care of horses, feed them, ride them moderately to let them exercise, brush them, and do other things with them. We can see the various feelings they have then. For example, when we brush them, it makes them feel good. In such cases, the area under their nose usually becomes wider. When they are treated very well, they usually press their heads and noses against people who they trust with their eyes partly shut. Furthermore, when horses want people to do something, they quite often paw on the ground. Also, horses are full of curiosity, so they stare at what they are interested in and raise their ears in the direction of what attracts their attention.

Although they are lovable and curious, they are sensitive to sounds, and are scared by sounds easily. In such situations, they show caution by raising their heads and turning their ears and eyes on the object that has scared them. If they put their ears behind back and turn them down while making a severe expression, they express anger, so we should be careful. If we make them mad, they may bite or kick us. In such cases, we can get badly injured because horses are generally bigger than us.

We can build relationships of trust with horses by considering what kind of mood they are in. If we understand their emotions, we can communicate with them well. We can say that horses are on good terms with us. We can ride them, so we can build deeper bonds with them than with any other animal.
